Read from the pulpit: February 21 and 28, 2021

February is Haiti Mission Month at PCOL.

For more than 30 years, the Presbyterian Church of Lawrenceville has been involved in the life and work of Harmony Ministries, based in Port-au-Prince, Haiti, which is led by our mission affiliate Pastor Luc Deratus. Since Pastor Luc cannot travel this year, the PCOL Haiti Task Force and the Pinnacle Presbyterian Church (Scottsdale, AZ) Haiti team have joined together to connect virtually with Pastor Luc, his family and Harmony Ministries. This morning, Jeff Vamos talks to Pastor Luc about the current conditions in Haiti and an update on Harmony Ministries.

Today, we will receive the Haiti Special Offering for the **Haiti General Fund**: to purchase food and medicine; bags to fill with rice; medicines; and to help subsidize the doctor at the medical clinic in Port-au-Prince four days a week. The Haiti Task Force has committed this support for two months for a total of \$9,000.

The two other funds for Haiti Support are:

Support a Student Fund, which supports students in the five Harmony Ministry schools. You can Support a Student for \$50 for one year.

Haiti Missionary Fund, which helps support Pastor Luc and his family with living expenses.
