### What's next at WiNK? A Lenten Series:

T.S. Eliot's *Four Quartets* is a set of four linked poems with a common theme of the human experience of time, the universe, and the divine. Eliot uses symbolic allusions, literary references and theological themes from both Eastern and Western thought throughout. The poems are challenging, provocative and beautiful; some rank the collection among the greatest achievements of western art, like Shakespeare's 'King Lear' or Mozart's Piano Concertos. Join us as we explore this rich and complex collection this season in Lent.

<sup>17</sup>How weighty to me are your thoughts, O God! How vast is the sum of them!
