Next Week, March 4, 2018: Taizé

Taizé-style worship uses simple, repetitive
songs, scripture readings, and extended
periods of silence to create an accessible and
meditative worship experience. In WiNK, we
practice Taizé the first Sunday of each month.

WiNK's Lenten Series will resume 3/11/18:

T.S. Eliot's Four Quartets is a set of four linked
poems with a common theme of the human
experience of time, the universe, and the
divine. Eliot uses symbolic allusions, literary
references and theological themes from both
Eastern and Western thought throughout. The
poems are challenging, provocative and
beautiful; some rank the collection among the
greatest achievements of western art, like
Shakespeare's 'King Lear' or Mozart's Piano
Concertos. Join us as we explore this rich and
complex collection this season in Lent.

Walking the Way of the Cross:

You are invited to experience the Lenten season in a
new way this year, as we consider Jesus' journey to
the cross. Come into the meetinghouse during the
day or evening to reflect on the artwork and deepen

your own Lenten journey New artwork will be
