Why focus on voter registration & education?

- There are a vast number of
 - unregistered voters; or had changed address
 - voters that feel that their vote does not count
- Only 86% of eligible voters are registered in Mercer
 - 90% in New Jersey; 73% in USA
- Only 59% of eligible voters in Mercer participated in the 2020 General Election
 - 53.7% Lawrence; 64.7% Hopewell; 61.0% Ewing; 34.3% Trenton
 - 74% in New Jersey; 67% in USA
